How can we end homelessness in our community?

PRAY. Read Isaiah 58:1-12, and sing "O God of Love, the Fast You Choose." Be reminded of the servant heart of Christ, and be willing to give of yourselves. Ask God for a vision of how you or your congregation can get involved.

LEARN. Connect with other congregations, presbyteries, & community organizations. What are others doing? Where are the needs?
